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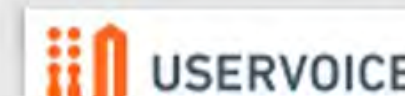
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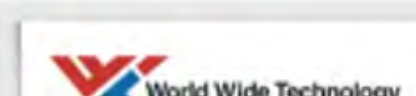

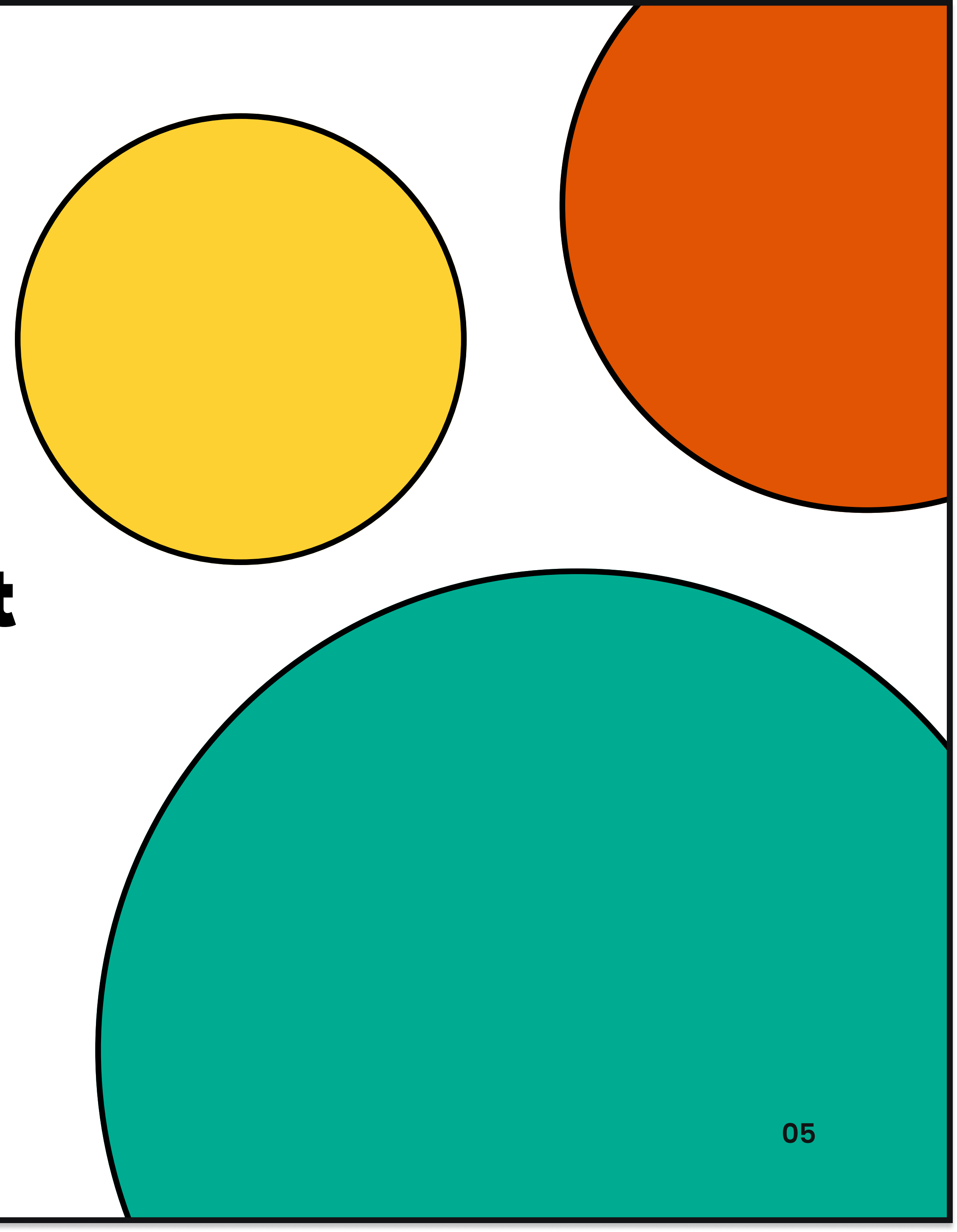

What is an affinity map?

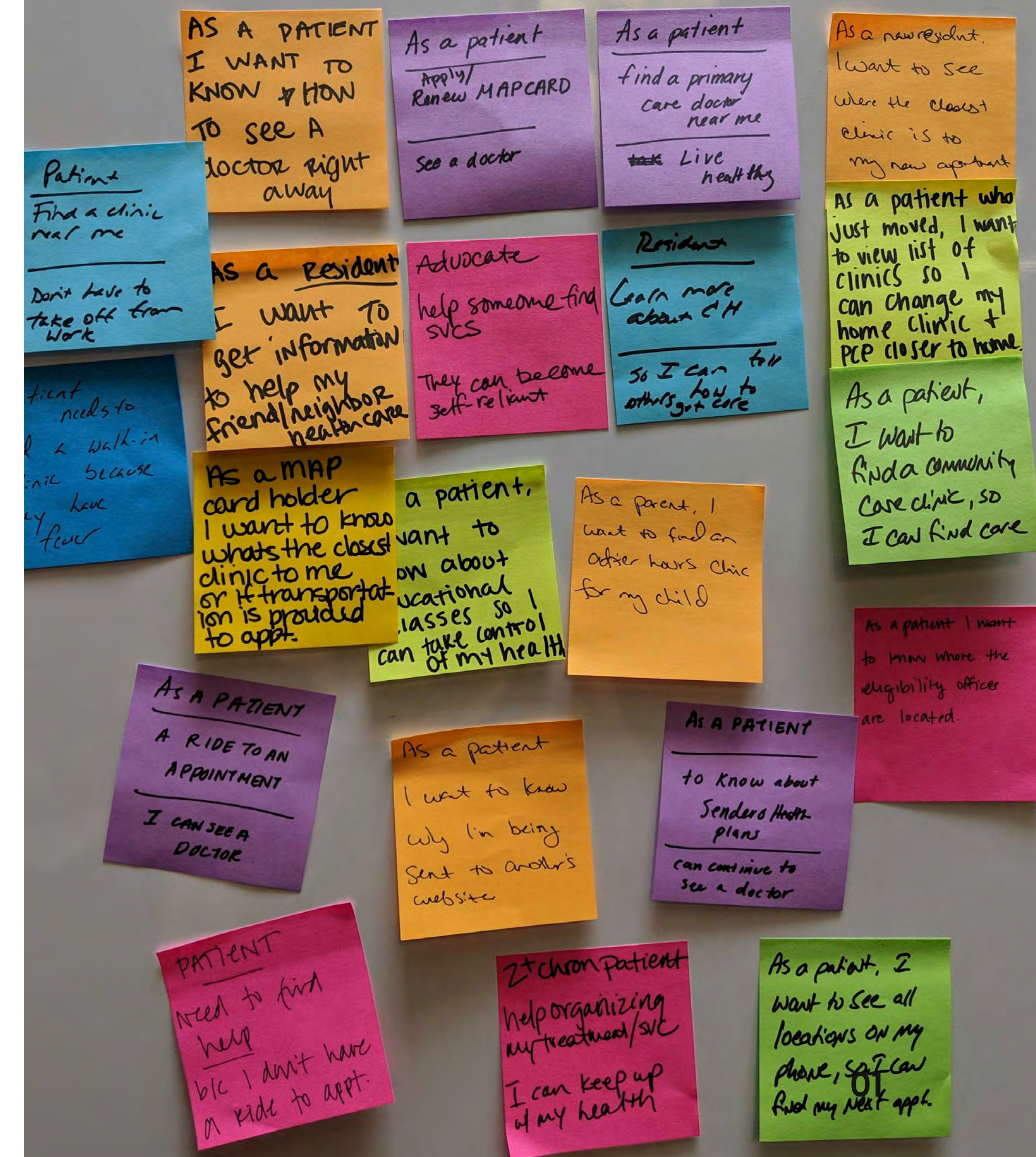
Hint: Your tool for creating ah-ha moments

Clustering exercises

Group and bundle ideas into natural relationships. Large amounts of ideas and data are clustered for analysis.

Making sense of data

Data can be from mixed sources -- comments, interviews, ideas, survey responses, or other qualitative data.

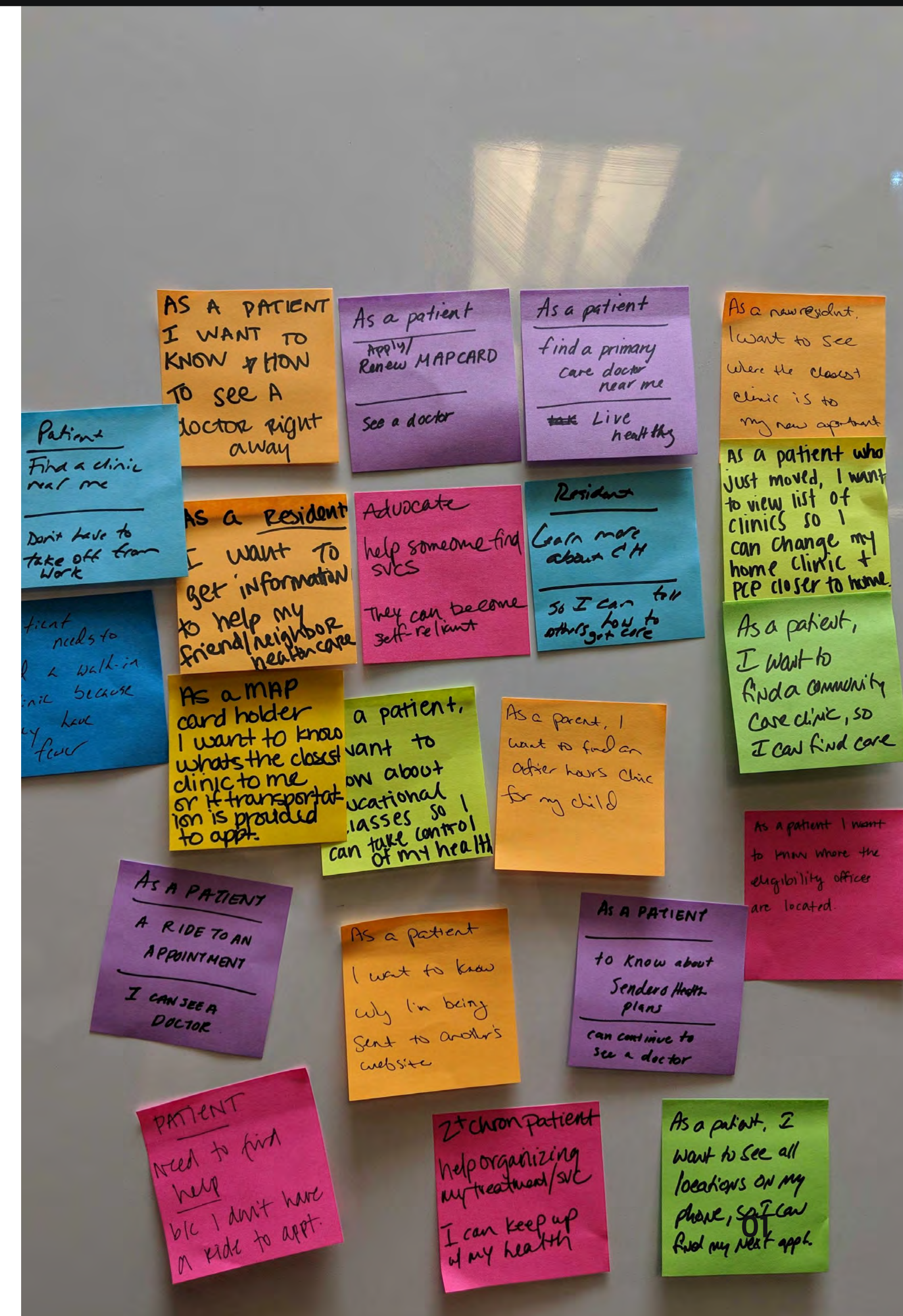


What is an affinity map?

Hint: Your tool for creating ah-ha moments

Idea generation tool

An affinity diagram was originally developed in the 1960's by Japanese anthropologist Kawakita Jiro. It's used to organize ideas and information to connect and form a thinking model.

Elements of an affinity map



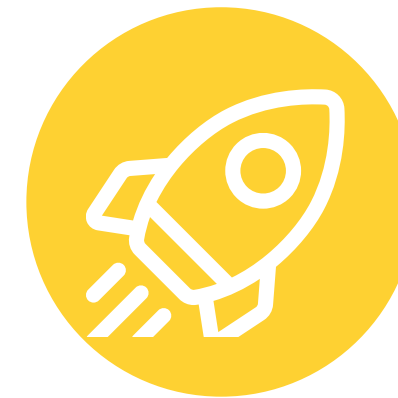
Purpose

Leader

A successful affinity mapping session
has a good facilitator.



Prepared Space

The team that creates an affinity map
needs a place to create the clusters.



Content

Affinity maps can be used to organize
data or ideas from a brainstorm.

Why Use It?

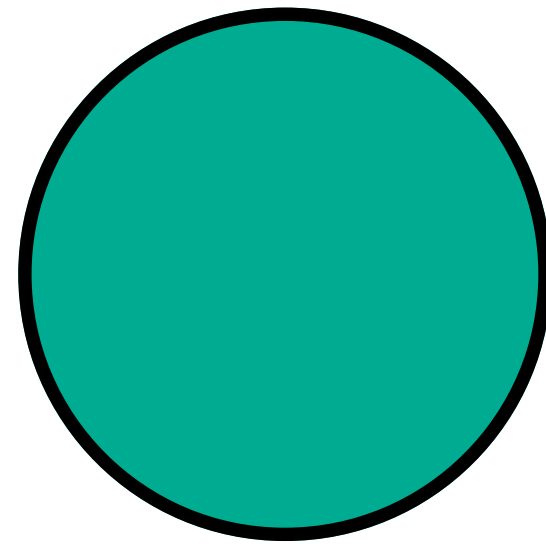
Affinity maps help us recognize patterns

- Promotes critical thinking

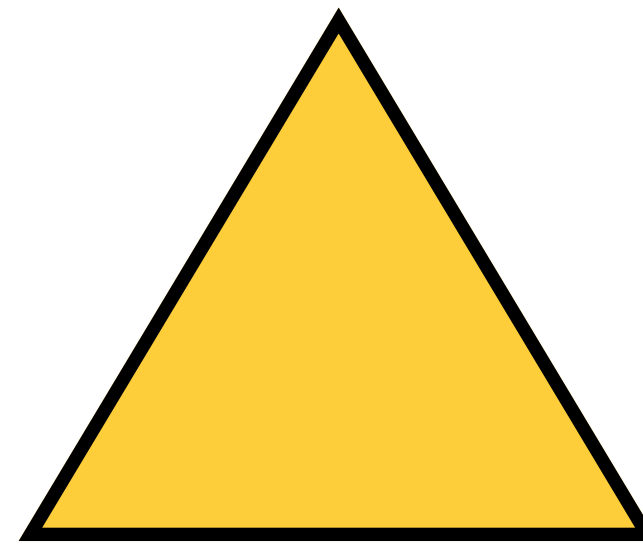
Why I Love Affinity Mapping

See Insights You Wouldn't Otherwise See



Pattern Discovery

Affinity Maps help us see patterns we don't otherwise see.



Dig Deep

By externalizing thoughts and data, we can probe deeper.



Simple & Inexpensive

Rather than use complex AI tools, we can use the most powerful tool of all -- our brains.

So Many Options, So Little Time

Because affinity maps help us see the big picture, they are a great way to look at a situation with greater detail.

This means you can use them in a variety of situations.

Affinity Map example

Get Stakeholders on the same page

When you work on a project with a lot of voices, affinity mapping can be helpful for aligning stakeholders.

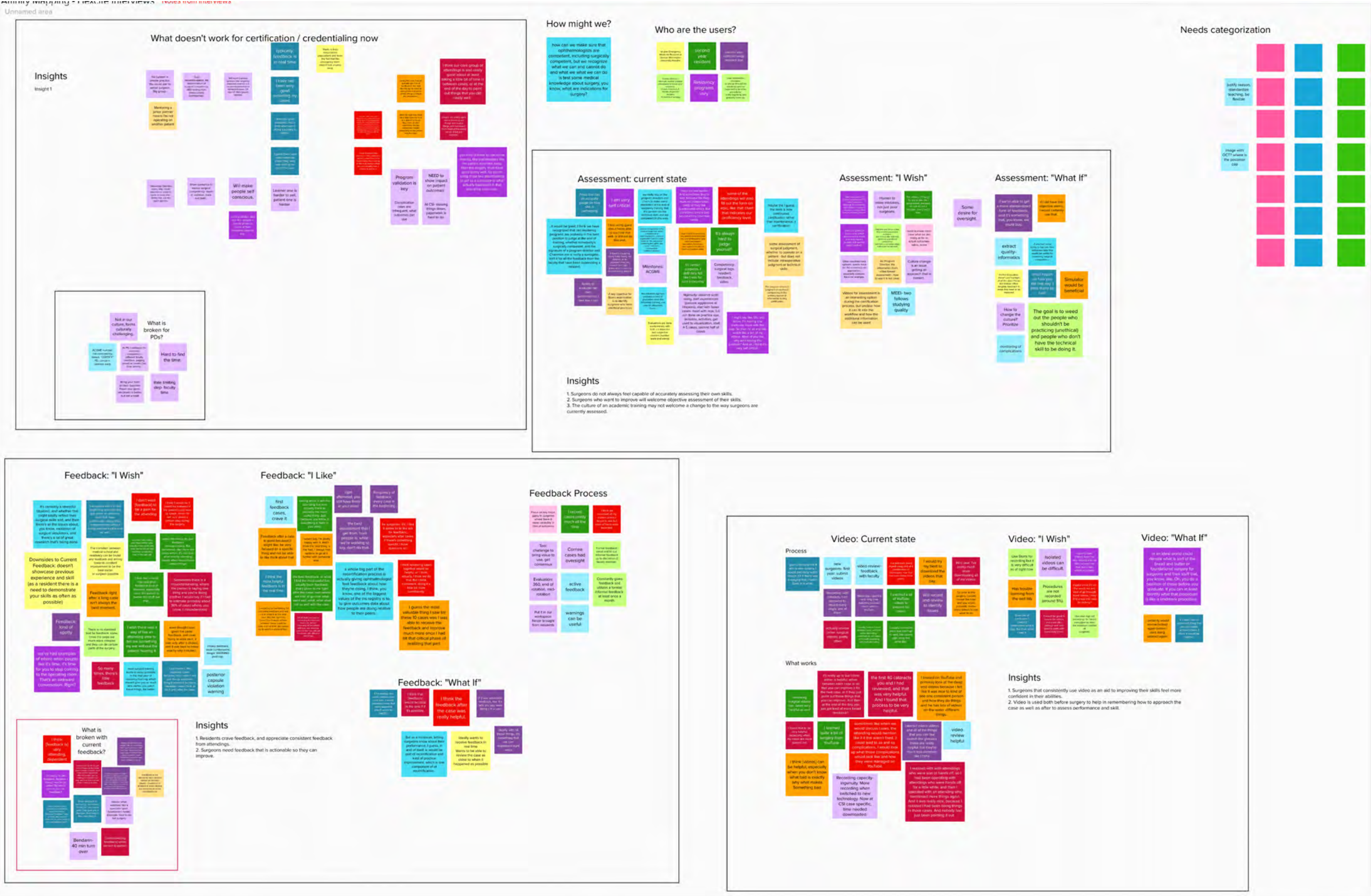


Customer Discovery

Learn from customers

Customers don't always tell you exactly what they want. Sometimes you have to read between the lines.

Find the pain points

Affinity maps are helpful through the research process. You can combine survey data, observations, desk research, and interviews to start making sense of the data.



Team Brainstorm

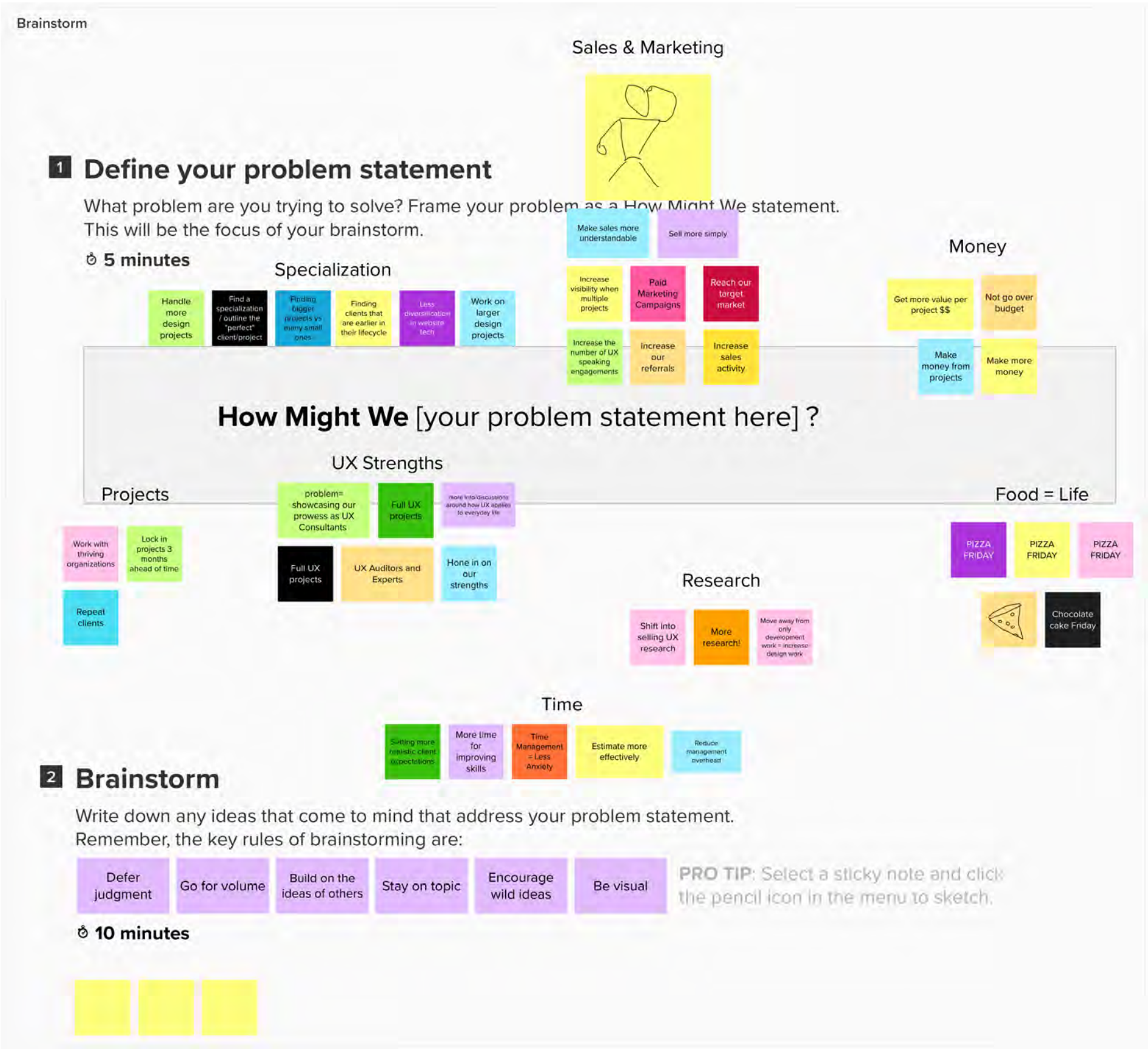
Affinity Map example

Unite your team

Affinity mapping exercises are the great equalizer. They ensure that every voice on the team can be heard.

Exercises like this can help pull ideas out of the team and put them front and center.

They're also fun!



How to Make an Affinity Map

Let's Talk Tactics

Make Sure You're Clear on Purpose

What are you hoping to accomplish with an affinity map?

What You Need

Time and Tools



Plan Enough Time

Make sure you give yourself plenty of time. Affinity maps can easily take more than an hour.



Sticky Notes & Sharpies

If you are in a physical space, have plenty of sticky notes on hand and sharpies for writing so you can see your writing from a distance.

Virtual tools like Miro and Mural are also a great option.



Large Whiteboard

Your whiteboard can be physical or virtual. You can also use a wall or table -- you just need a space to spread out.



Dot Stickers

Dot stickers let teams vote on key ideas -- very useful for brainstorming!

Miro and Mural also have "dots" you can use for voting sessions.



Affinity Mapping Preparation

Here are the steps to take to get started



Be Diverse

A diverse team helps bring different ideas and perspectives.

Facilitator Skills

A good faciliator sets the tone for the session. It's critical this person be right for the job.

Use Cases

Affinity mapping can be used for multiple purposes.

What are you trying to learn?

Prep Data

Break down the data into pieces:

- Highlight interesting points

Online or In-Person

Find a place where you can spread out your ideas:

- Wall
- Whiteboard
- Table
- Online software?

Be a Good Moderator

It's An Important Job

Be a Listener

A session moderator should have good people skills and have some empathy -- this includes great listening skills.

Have Some Presence

The moderator should have some natural presence or authority so that everyone pays attention to them as they guide the activity.

Stay Objective

A moderator must stay neutral so that they don't become a voice that sways the session.



Add Ideas / Data

Step 1

Break Out Those Sticky Notes

It's up to you how you use color. Some teams use it to show different types of data, people, or team members.

One Idea Per Sticky

Add one idea per sticky note. Give yourself enough time to do this if you're working with a lot of data!

Get all of the ideas out -- now is not the time to filter.



Group Ideas

Step 2

Use Silent Sorting

Wait until all of the ideas are on the table before starting this step.

Keep Looking for Patterns

It's OK to come back to this step again and again. Sometimes patterns take time to be uncovered.



Categorize Groups

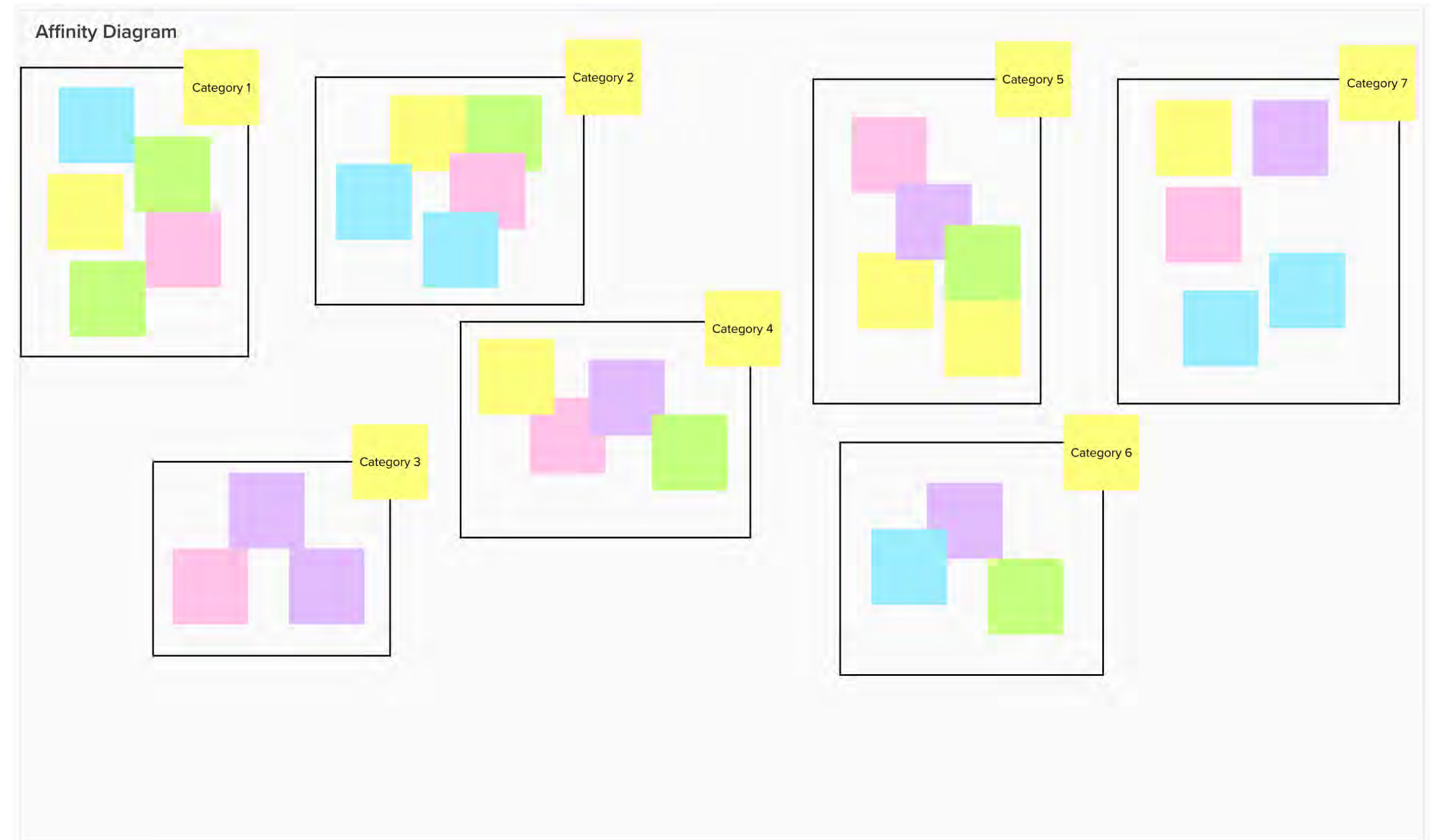
Step 3

Label the groups

Draw boxes or circles around the groups and give each one a label.

Capture the Data

Take a picture or export the map so you have it to refer to.



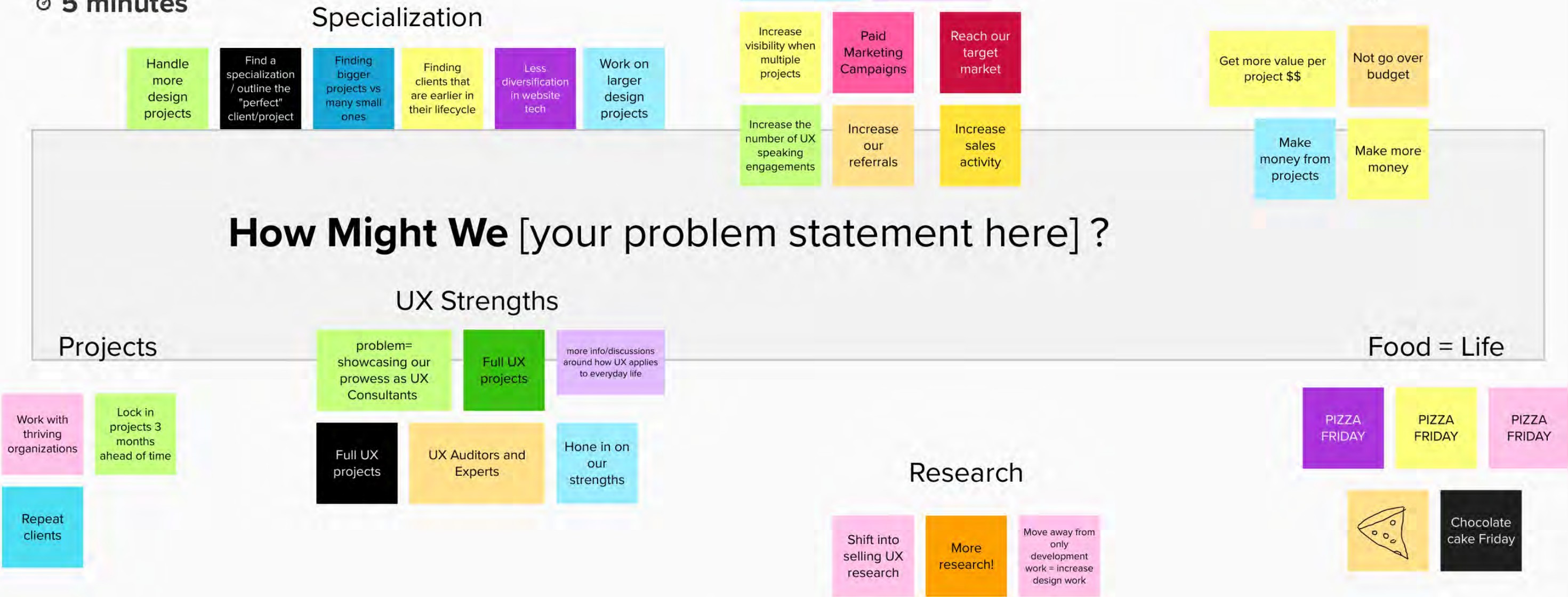

1 Define your problem statement

What problem are you trying to solve? Frame your problem as a How Might We statement. This will be the focus of your brainstorm.

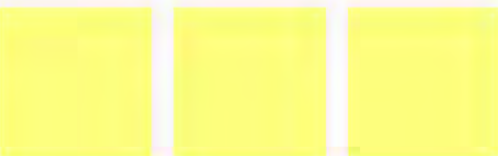


2 Brainstorm

Write down any ideas that come to mind that address your problem statement. Remember, the key rules of brainstorming are:

- Defer judgment
- Go for volume
- Build on the ideas of others
- Stay on topic
- Encourage wild ideas
- Be visual

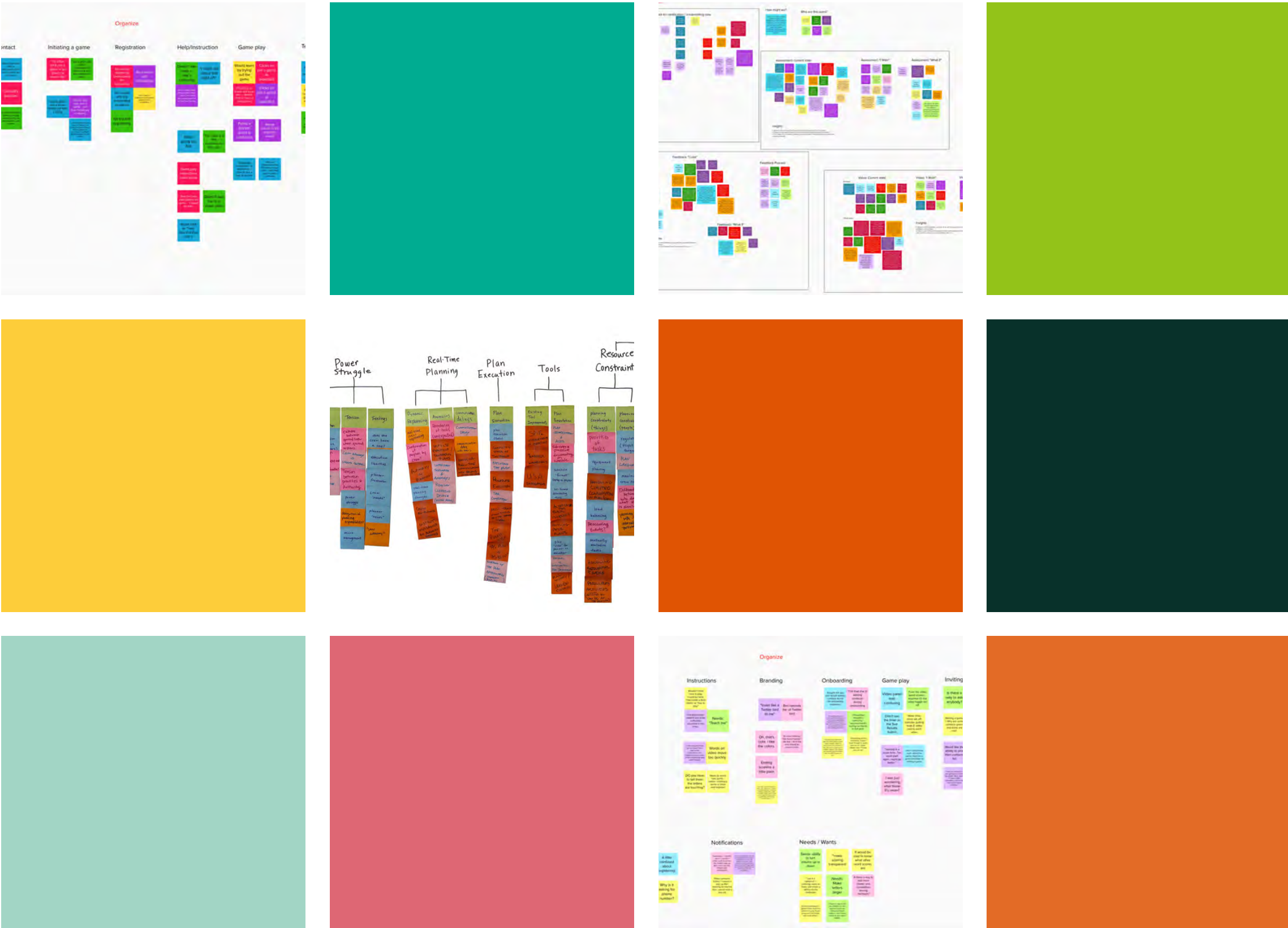

Remote Considerations

Online is not the same as in-person



Pay attention to moderation

Good moderation is even more important online. Online distractions can prevent team members from fully participating or being engaged in the process.

Be sure to keep the activity moving so that team members don't check out.

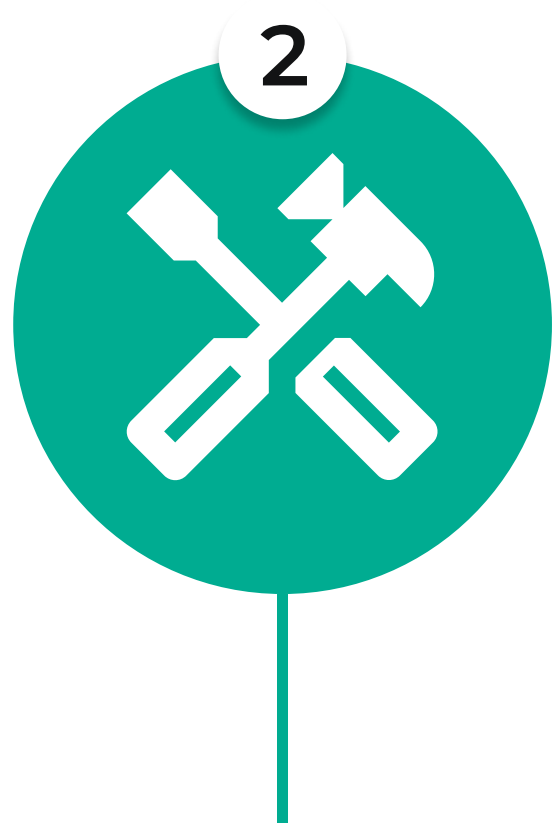
Remote Considerations

Tools

There are many tools you can use to conduct sessions. Miro and Mural both make this an easier process.



Training

Always be sure to practice with the tool a few times so you feel comfortable with it. Don't learn a new tool on the fly.



Set Expectations

Let participants know your expectations for enagement. Ask people to turn off distractions if needed.

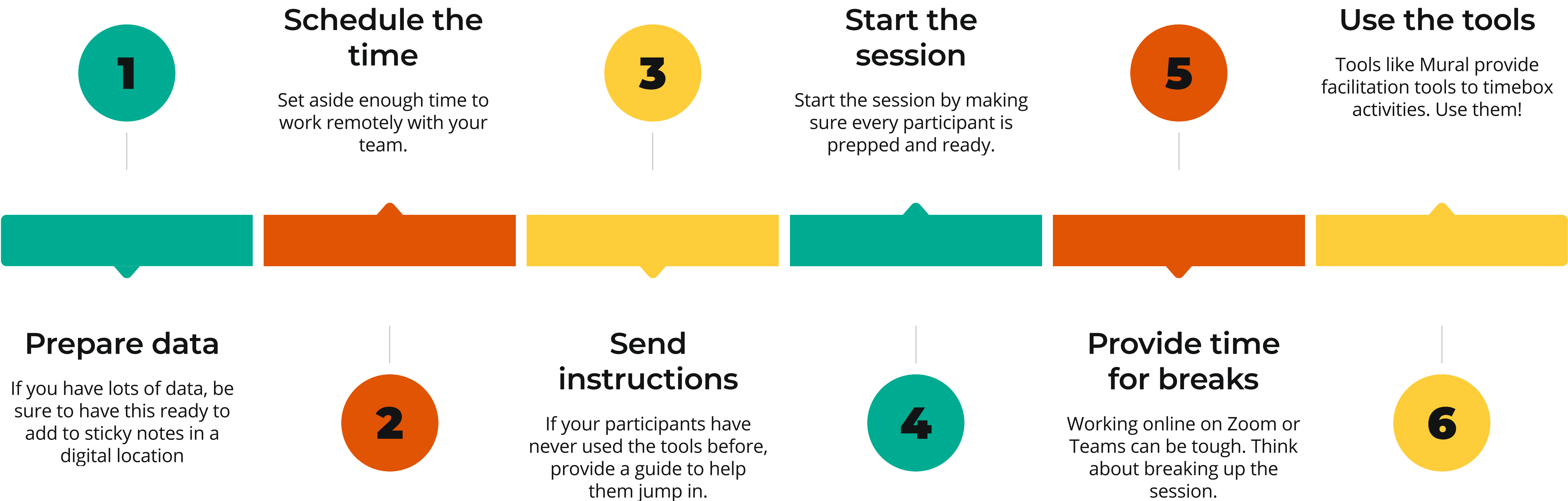


Be Prepared

Some session may require prep work. Be sure to have data, notes or guidelines ready ahead of time.
